RABBI'S SHABBAT MESSAGE

The most essential rule of thumb to use when it comes to kashering your kitchen for Passover is this; if you're in doubt-don't use it, unlike throughout the rest of the year, there is a wide area of leniency to be drawn from when it comes to determining the kashruth of something. But on Passover all of these leniencies are thrown out the window. When it comes to "chametz", there is a zero-tolerance rule. So let's get started and use this handy reference list to work your way through the house.

Bedrooms, living rooms, basements and garages - If you have brought food into these areas during the year, carefully vacuum and clean out the rooms. Check under sofas and cushions to make sure that you got all those cookie crumbs!

Car - If you're like me, then you eat in the car! Bring it to a car wash and have them clean the inside of the car. Afterwards, take 10 minutes and vacuum out the car again getting under the seats.

Work - If you don't own the business, just give your desk drawers, cleaning, and put away all of the non-kosher for Passover food.

Kitchen - This is the big one! Look over these highlights to refresh you memory;

- ⇒ Change dishes.
- ⇒ Kasher Oven.
- ⇒ Kasher microwave.
- ⇒ Clean and put down counter covers, tablecloths, towels.
- ⇒ Put away all NKP (Non-Kosher for Passover) food so that you can't see it.
- ⇒ Do not use the dishwasher.
- ⇒ Carefully check all of the food labels...
- ⇒ Bathroom (toothbrush, paste, cologne, mouthwash...) Any product with alcohol should be certified for Passover use.

Remember that the Bedikah – the Search – for Chametz will start 1 hour after sunset on Thursday evening. On Friday, Chametz must not be eaten after 11:00am. Forms for selling Chametz are available through the Synagogue office, by fax or email.
